A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF GOLD HILL TO SET COUNCIL MEETINGS

WHEREAS, the City Charter of the City of Gold Hill has vested authority and power to the City Council to conduct business, and

WHEREAS, the City has established a standard to observe all federally recognized holidays.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council shall meet a minimum of once a month with the following schedule:

- 1. Regular Council Meetings. The Council shall meet at 6:00 p.m. on the first Tuesday of each month in the City Hall Council Chamber or at any place that the Council may direct. In the event a regularly scheduled meeting falls on an official holiday, the meeting shall be held at the same hour on the next following day that is not a holiday.
- 2. <u>Special Meetings</u>. The Mayor, or in the Mayor's absence, the Presiding Officer may call a special meeting of the Council. Three Councilors may also call a special meeting by filing a request with the City Recorder. Notice shall be given to each Councilor at least 24 hours in advance of the meeting.
- 3. <u>Emergency Meetings</u>. An emergency meeting of the Council may be called on less than 24 hours' notice provided that an actual emergency exists. The minutes of such meeting must describe the emergency justifying less than 24 hours' notice and, and the Council must be able to point to some reason why the meeting could not be delayed.
- 4. <u>Workshop Meetings</u>. Workshop meetings may be scheduled as necessary by the Mayor or at the request of the majority of the members of the Council. Workshop meetings are informal sessions to review upcoming issues, receive special reports, conduct goal setting sessions and for special training purposes.
- 5. <u>Executive Sessions</u>. An executive session (a meeting closed to the public) may be held in accordance with the Oregon Public Meetings Law. The Mayor or Presiding Officer or any two members of the Council may call any regular, special, or emergency meeting into executive session by citing the specific provision of ORS 192.660 which authorizes the session.
