

RESOLUTION NO. 20-R-09

A RESOLUTION SCHEDULING BIENNIAL ELECTION OF GOLD HILL CITY OFFICERS
ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020

WHEREAS, the Gold Hill City Charter provides that each biennial general election three councilmen shall be elected, each for a term of four years, and a mayor shall be elected for a term of two years, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 89-03 provides that the municipal judge shall be elected in the general election of each numbered year evenly divisible by the number four, and

WHEREAS, the next biennial general election is scheduled for November 3, 2020; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLD HILL, OREGON, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The biennial election of the City of Gold Hill, Oregon, shall be held concurrently with the general election of the State of Oregon on November 3, 2020, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. Pacific Standard Time, at which election the City shall elect three council members at large, one mayor, and one municipal judge.

Section 2. The precincts and judges and clerks of election shall be the same as those provided within the City of Gold Hill, Oregon, for the statewide general election held on the same date.

Section 3. The City Recorder is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of said election, at least 10 days prior to the election, by posting notice thereof in a conspicuous place in the City Hall and in one public place in each voting precinct of the City. The notice shall state the officers to be elected, the ballot title of each measure to be voted upon and the time and place of the election.

Section 4. All candidates for the offices mentioned in Section 1 above shall file their certificates or petitions of nomination with the City Recorder during normal business hours between Tuesday, June 2, 2020, and Tuesday, August 25, 2020.
